Biographical Note

The local League of Women Voters began as a provincial group of 100 members in 1966. Upon completion of the booklet "Know Your Community" (covering Gloucester and Rockport) the organization became a member of the state League of Women Voters in 1968. The League's primary role is to inform the public of issues at a local level as well as a broader general interest. The League, most often on local TV, interviews candidates for local offices.

Studies on a local level include harbor usage, water resources, sewers, housing, juvenile justice, local health care, legalized casino gambling and education. On a broader side, the League

Scope and Content of the Collection

The documents of the Cape Ann League of Women Voters cover the years 1966 - 2000. The documents detail local concerns as well as issues of a wider impact. The members form a consensus opinion and then present the pros and cons of their study to the public. An important part of the League is to encourage people to vote and informing them of local issues and candidates' stances.

The documents include membership lists, minutes of meetings and bulletins from 1970 - 2000.
