Biographical Note

Marion Scott Arnold Harding was born in Rockport, Massachusetts, on January 1, 1936, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. John Keppler Arnold of Rockport. She graduated from Gloucester High School in 1954 and Wheaton College in 1958. She was married on June 18, 1960, to Lawrence Bruce Harding of Gloucester. The couple moved to Philadelphia while Lawrence finished college, after which they moved to Rockport, where they remained permanently and where their three children, Tamsen, Elizabeth, and David Bruce, were born.

Before her marriage Marion was a staff member of the Education Department of the Museum of Fine Arts in Boston. After her marriage and in the early years of parenting and as a result of her art historical background, she volunteered at the Cape Ann Museum, shortly before becoming a paid curatorial assistant. Among her achievements was the completion of a catalogue of the Museum's furniture collection. In addition to working at the Museum, she was involved in a number of community activities centering on the Rockport schools, the Addison Gilbert Hospital, St. Mary's Episcopal Church and the Red Cross. She also enjoyed cooking, gardening, skiing, and sailing.

Lawrence Bruce "Larry" Harding was born in Gloucester on April 25, 1939, to Richard E. and Anne E. (Scott) Harding. He was a graduate of Gloucester High School, Class of 1957, where he was a member of the celebrated 1956-1957 football team that played in the Orange Bowl in Florida. He also played varsity baseball and basketball, was a second lieutenant in the GHS R.O.T.C., and was inducted into the Gloucester High School Hall of Fame.

He graduated from the Wharton School of Business of the University of Pennsylvania in 1962, where he was a member of the football team and Alpha Tau Omega fraternity.

He began his career in business with EG&G, Inc. in Boston, after which he was employed for many years at Instrumentation Laboratories, Inc., in Lexington. As an independent consultant, he worked with the Raytheon Career Center. When he retired, he was vice-president of human resources at Visualization Technology, Inc., of Wilmington.

He was a congregant of St. Mary's Episcopal Church in Rockport and served as an usher and past member of the vestry. In addition, he served on the Rockport School Committee from 1973 to 1976 and was a corporator of the Granite Savings Bank of Rockport.

He was also a member of the Rockport Golf Club and the Sandy Bay Yacht Club. He especially enjoyed skiing with his family and became an avid golfer in his later years. He died on December 2, 2000, after a battle with colon cancer, leaving his wife, three children and five grandchildren.

Scope and Content of the Collection

Brief description: Family memorabilia from high school on. Includes items on the *Ernestina* and Walker Hancock.

This collection brings together documents reflecting the lives of Marion and Lawrence Harding from their high school days through their marriage, including high school diplomas, dance and sports programs, news clippings of athletic events, athletic awards, wedding announcements, social functions, family photographs, and photographs of Lawrence's participation in sports events, award dinners, and reunions.

The collection includes copies of the Gloucester High School Yearbook, *The Flicker*, 1952-1957, class reunion booklets, dance cards and R.O.T.C. dance programs, and Cadet Anniversary celebrations.

The collection also includes brochures, photographs and news articles relating to the schooner *Ernestina* (formerly *Effie M. Morrisey*), Gloucester's 350th Anniversary booklet, a videotape "Legacy—Shipbuilders, Fisherman & the Age of Gloucester Schooners," photographs of Rockport's streets and houses, postcards of paintings of local subjects, including those by Rockport artist Anthony Thieme, and greeting cards from friends and family.

Of special importance in this collection is a folder containing news articles, announcements, and correspondence from and about noted sculptor Walker Hancock (1901-1998), including a list of local models, a photograph of a Hancock sculpture inscribed by the artist to Larry Harding, and a letter from the sculptor's daughter Deanie Hancock to the Hardings, 12/14/99.
